Water Study premiered October 28, 1928, at New York City's Civic Repertory Theatre with this program note from Doris Humphrey: "Probably the thing that distinguishes musical rhythm from other rhythm is the measured time beast, so this has been eliminated from the "Water Study" and the rhythm flows in natural phrases instead of cerebral measures. There is no count to hold the dancers together in the very slow opening rhythm, only the feel of the wavelength that curves the back of the group."

Almost 90 years later, critic Marcia Siegel noted that "as small and strange as it is, *Water Study* is a masterpiece of the choreographic art," while stager Lesley Main states, "I regard *Water Study* as a cornerstone of Humphrey's tradition because it embodies the first representation of her movement philosophy."
